With over a million visitors to date on their blog and tens of thousands of followers across their social media accounts, the gay couple travel blog Couple of Men also strives to educate the travel industry as LGBTIQ+ advocates and ambassadors.

"We think the travel industry should be more inclusive by directing its focus on the diversity of our community. Just putting LGBTIQ+ in front of your gay-male-oriented hotel/cruise/trip doesn't mean you are actually catering to the needs and wishes of a wider community. We and our readers would like to see a broader field of trips, hotels, and activities that cater to different niches and are open to anybody who feels they are part of that community." - Couple of Men.

## Sustainability, Community, Diversity - The three pillars reflecting a new world of travel

For the past 10 years, Lonely Planet has held its Best in Travel awards every Autumn listing the countries, regions, and cities that are recommended as travel destinations for the following year. So far, the campaign has been launched as a book and also an online digital campaign with a reach of millions around the globe. But Travel is always changing.
